Scientific Debates

The topic of debate this session was Artificial Intelligence (AI). In a new format, more closely resembling a formal debate, two pairs of students presented 'pro' and 'con' sides of AI. Each speaker began with their opening statement, presented within 3 min with the aid of powerpoint. This gave a general overview of their argument. Afterwards, the debating pinged back and forth between the presenting pair. After both pairs had presented, the audience split into small groups to discuss the topic. We held a vote to determine which speaker had been the most persuasive. Much of the argument was clear and logical, however, some relied on logical fallacies, such as the 'appeal to authority' and emotion.
