Summary: CICASP Seminar 66 Scientific Writing (2/3) - Abstracts

This was the second in a block of three seminars aimed at giving advice and practise at scientific writing. The topic was writing an effective abstract for a scientific journal article. Abstracts are a brief summary of the whole manuscript, following the IMRaD format (introduction, methods, results, discussion). The seminar included three class activities. First, students were handed a piece of paper on which part of an abstract was written. Their task was to find the others with the missing parts of the same abstract by asking questions in their own words, not the words on the paper. The next task was to identify what section was missing from an edited abstract (introduction, methods, results or discussion). All groups aced this task. The final task was to write an abstract for an existing article. By the end of the seminar, each group had composed an effective abstract. Each member of the team wrote one of the four necessary components of the abstract before combining these as a group. This collaborative teamwork approach worked very well.

Scientific Writing (3/3) – Cover Letter and keywords
