## Summary: CICASP Seminar 17 Mini-Debate about a 'hot' topic

In this session, the subject of debate was genome editing. This is a very 'hot' issue; on 1st–3rd December, hundreds of scientists and bioethicists met in Washington DC for the International Summit on Human Gene Editing. The recent development of a new technique, CRISPR/Cas9 has made it simpler and more widely accessible to edit genomes. Groups read short summaries from scientific journals, science magazines and a variety of news sources. Topics ranged from the potential for 'designer babies', gene therapy for human disease, creating custom-pets to the potential for using gene editing to eradicate malaria. Students were ready to dispute the pros and cons of genome editing and all used the opportunity to put across various points. The debate was lively and participants argued logically.
