Summary: CICASP Seminar 22 Practice Presentations for PWS Annual Meeting

This session was the second in the block of three giving students the opportunity to further improve their posters or oral presentations and obtain practice in answering questions. Both volunteer speakers presented their research on chimpanzees. Duncan Wilson gave his talk on attention facilitation and disengagement and Gao Jie spoke about her empirical work investigating understanding of circular relationships. A very important point is that there are no absolute rights or wrongs; there is a huge variety of opinions on what is best to include or exclude in talk-slides. Students can listen to advice and take on board what they find most useful and relevant. However, when preparing presentations it is essential to consider your target audience.
