What we'd like you to do is come to next week's seminar ready to discuss this topic and informally share your ideas with the group. In doing so, we will build a list of strategies you might use to engage with the public on various issues. For example, Nahoko used social media and then wrote a newspaper article with a journalist. Marie wrote her article for the French chapter of The Conversation, an online journalistic forum where scientists can have their say on a given topic. There are endless possibilities out there, so don't be afraid to get creative with your ideas on how you might attempt to shift the conversation in a direction you feel is more appropriate.

Lastly, don't think it has to be about conservation—These are just a few examples of the kinds of conversations scientists can and should have with the public, but there are many others, e.g. in industry, in medicine, in entertainment, in education, etc. We'd like to hear all about it from you.
