I also joined the research seminar in KIZ which hosted by Dr. Wang. And I worked together with her staffs to meet with research partners from Guizhou University. We aimed to organize a preliminary investigation for François’s Langur in Yezhong Natural Reserve in Guizhou China in Dec 2019 (Time to be determined). I continued working on behavior observation by using drone in Laojun Mountain National Park, and join the TNC routine work in Lijiang office as internship. And I carried out a community investigation of ethno-primatological study in Liju Village at the mountain foot of Laojun Mountain. The data collection was kept on track and making progresses as it planned to be. However, I got an ankle sprain during the a walking and interviewing, it was an unexpected setback at the last day in Liju. Even worse, I had to leave for Kyoto from Kunming in two days with my right foot in plaster.
